Code Amendments	The C&E Team are currently involved in the delivery of communications and engagement activities for the following Code Amendments:

	<ul> <li>Hackham Code Amendment – an engagement report is in progress and expected to be published before the end of the year.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Miscellaneous Technical Enhancement – a post engagement survey of participants was undertaken, and the engagement report is being finalised; expected to be released in 2023.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Flooding Hazards Mapping (Stage 1) Project – consultation to commence on 13 December 2022.</li> </ul>

Performance Indicators Scheme Report 2021-22	The Performance Indicators Scheme Report 2021-22 was tabled by the Minister in Parliament in November 2022. However, a minor amendment to Building Consents has been made in the report and will be republished once tabled by Parliament. The report will be promoted in the December <i>Planning Ahead</i> newsletter.
Regional Planning Program	Bret Woods continues leading the communications and engagement aspects of this project.
	The first visioning workshop will commence in Kangaroo Island on 9 December 2022, with Commission members invited to attend future workshops where available. The Chair will be attending the Kangaroo Island workshop.
	Further visioning workshops are yet to be locked in but currently proposed for 7-9 February 2023 for the Eyre and Western region and 16-17 February 2023 for the Yorke and Mid North region.
	Dates for other regions will be set in late February and March 2023.
Review of Community Engagement Charter	As part of the Commission's 2022-23 Work Plan, a five-year review of the Community Engagement Charter (the Charter) is required to be completed in 2023. A 'Scheme' which is required under section 45 of the <i>Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016</i> to support the Charter review has been approved by the Minister. An engagement plan will be developed in 2023 based on that scheme, and engagement will commence thereafter.

Bushfire shelters	The C&E Team is working with Land and Built Environment Directorate (Building Policy Unit) on external communications to educate South Australia residents in bushfire areas (and planning professionals) of shelter requirements.
	A new page on the PlanSA website will be published following receipt of final feedback from the South Australian Country Fire Service (CFS) on draft communications. The CFS is reluctant to promote bushfire shelters as they see these as a last resort and no replacement for "leaving early". Therefore, measured communications will emphasise that shelters "provide no guarantee they will save your life" and there is a stringent planning, development and approval process which is critical to follow, should you wish to construct one.
Climate change brochure	Work is underway to create a brochure to communicate the work of the Commission and PLUS in the climate change space. It is expected to be finalised during December 2022.
Trees and green canopy	There has been an increase in correspondence received about the protection of trees and green canopy. While the Commission and PlanSA website's includes substantial information about the topic, an audit against correspondence is being conducted to help determine the best communications approach moving forward.

## <u>Media</u>

Corporate video	A revised Commission corporate video is in progress incorporating feedback received from Commission Members. It is expected to be finalised in late 2022/early 2023.
Media interest	The following media enquiries/activities occurred since the previous Communications and Engagement update:
	<ul> <li>20 November 2022: MoU with LGA and commencement of Regional Planning engagement sessions – resulted in strong radio and press coverage in the regions.</li> </ul>
	30 November 2022: A <u>Building Ideas</u> segment focused on the Green Adelaide and Commission publication, <u>Adelaide Garden Guide for New Homes</u> , to involve interview with Alison Collins and Craig Lovering (paid for by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet, so State Government practitioners were requested).

## Other Business

Key Element	Status
Expert Panel	Formal consultation closes on 16 December 2022. North Projects has been contracted to undertake the consultation activities. In-person engagement activities in progress late November/early December 2022.
C&E Team staffing	The Communications and Engagement Manager position has been advertised with interviews held in early December 2022 (a new Manager is not likely to start until the new year).
	Consultant (Sara Polec) is available on a part-time basis (20 hours per week) until 16 December 2022, and DTI Media Coordinator, Nora Liambis, will subsequently act in the role until the new Manager is appointed. The C&E Team will have less capacity until the Manager position is filled, and Bret Woods' position in the team is backfilled.
	The team will continue to work closely with DTI's media and communications unit during this time, to ensure media issues are managed appropriately and urgently over the Christmas and holiday break.
